Program Description

Tullibee Lakes Healthy Forests Healthy Waters (HFHW) grants are made to select Soil and Water Conservation Districts to cost-share in the implementation of forestry conservation practices. Improved forest management practices can help reduce phosphorus runoff and maintain water quality. While these funds are represented as one grant type in eLINK and share the same reporting requirements, they are actually two separate grant programs; Tullibee Lakes grants target cisco lakes in the northern part of the state, while Healthy Forests Healthy Waters grants target trout streams in the southern part of the state.

Reporting Overview

Tullibee Lakes HFHW grants are subject to the requirements outlined in the grant agreement, State Cost Share rules, and the policies within BWSR's Grants Administration Manual.

A workplan is not required. However, all expenses and actual results should be reported in eLINK. Activity Details should be completed for any on-the-ground projects, including mapping and pollution reduction indicators.
