- July 16 and 17**      Wetland Leadership Team – Review Final Draft Rule; Decide staff position on significant outstanding issues.
- July 23**              Board Wetland Committee – Begin Review of Final Draft Rule.
- July 24, 25, 29**      WCA Rule Staff Team – Review Final Draft Rule; Resolve remaining Issues (*will meet on an as needed basis through December*).
- August 11**            WCA Rule Technical Committee – Begin Review of Final Draft Rule.
